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# **Appeals Documents List**

#### A list of documents generally required for appeals according to Special Circumstance Type.

**Note:** For purposes of reviewing appeals for special circumstances, the Department of Education has established 2023 as the "base year" for determining financial aid eligibility. A student's financial aid offer is established first using the base year, and consideration of special circumstances will usually involve a review of financial circumstances in years other than the base year.

#### **Excessive Medical or Emergency Expenses**

#### Excessive Medical Expenses

- Documentation of medical issue: such as a physician's letter, documentation of health issue(s), or a medical summary from a healthcare professional
- Documentation of out-of-pocket medical expenses: Schedule A
  - Schedule A (from tax return year corresponding to the appeal year selected)
  - Medical expenses paid must exceed 10% of income
- Parent(s)' Tax Return(s) (1040 form signed with all schedules included)
  - 2023 Parent Tax Return if year 2023 selected
  - 2023 & 2024 Parent Tax Returns if year 2024 selected

#### Emergency Expenses

- Detailed statement of emergency
- Documentation supporting appeal request
  - Documents showing emergency occurred
  - Documents showing how much was paid out of pocket because of the emergency

# Involuntary Loss or Reduction in Employment Income (Note: must be submitted 90 days after loss of employment)

- Parent(s) Personal Statement
- Any Loss/Reduction of Employment Income: Employer's Statement (disclosing termination date & severance details)
- Loss of Employment: Unemployment Benefit statement, Unemployment Benefit denial letter, or signed statement addressing why the document cannot be obtained
- Parent(s)' Tax Return(s) (1040 form signed with all schedules included)
  - o 2023 Parent Tax Return if year 2023 selected
  - o 2023 & 2024 Parent Tax Returns if year 2024 selected
- Income Projection (Appealing for 2025, after July 1, 2025)
  - Parent(s)'s 2025 Pay stubs (reflecting at least 6 months of gross earnings)
- 2025-2026 Parent Estimated Income Form (available after July 1)

### **Involuntary Loss or Reduction in Untaxed Income**

- Parent Personal Statement
- Parent(s)' Tax Return(s) (1040 form signed with all schedules included)
  - o 2023 Parent Tax Return if year 2023 selected
  - o 2023 & 2024 Parent Tax Returns if year 2024 selected
- Parent(s)' 2023 W-2/1099 forms
- Benefit Documents
- Social Security
  - Letter from state or federal agency overseeing program
    - Termination/Reduction of Benefits Date
    - Amount of Benefits
- Child Support (An asset in 2025-2026)
  - Copy of Court Order
    - Termination/Reduction Date
    - Amount of Support
- Alimony
  - Copy of Court Order
    - Termination/Reduction Date
    - Amount of Alimony
- Income Projection (Appealing for 2025, after July 1, 2025)
  - 2025-2026 Parent Estimated Income Form

### One-Time Event Generating Non-Recurring Source of Income 2023\*

- Parent Personal Statement (disclosing what was the source of the non-recurring income generated by the one-time event)
- Parent(s)' 2022, 2023, and 2024 Tax Returns (1040 form signed with all schedules included)
- Parent(s)' 2023 W-2/1099 forms

## Death of Parent or Spouse After FAFSA Filing

- Death Certificate (copy)
- Life Insurance Payment(s) Statement (if applicable)
- Parent(s)' 2023 Tax Returns (1040 form signed with all schedules included)
- Parent(s)' 2023 W-2/1099 forms

#### **Optional**

Parent(s)' 2024 Tax Returns- (1040 form signed with all schedules included)

<sup>\*</sup>Students may have only **one** appeal approved for a one-time event during their undergraduate academic career. Families are encouraged to select the year in which a one-time source of income generated the most impact.

# Divorce or Separation <u>After FAFSA Filing</u> (with divorced or separated, parents or spouses <u>living</u> <u>separately</u>)

- Divorce Decree or Separation Agreement (from a lawyer or court)
- Signed Marital Status Statement
- Documentation of Living in Separate Residences
- FAFSA Parent of Record's 2023 Tax Return (1040 form signed with all schedules included)
- Parent's 2023 W-2/1099 forms
- Asset Confirmation Request Form (FAFSA Parent of Record)
- Asset Confirmation Request Form (Non-FAFSA Parent of Record)

## Optional

- Non-FAFSA Parent of Record's 2024 Tax Return (1040 form signed with all schedules included) (if the Non-FAFSA Parent of Record did not file "married, filing jointly" for the 2024 tax year)
- FAFSA Parent of Record's 2024 Tax Returns (1040 form signed with all schedules included)
